- Be current on District and OI dues.
- Distinguished Club:

(watch for club President, secretary and/or treasurer. Banner patch with Club President's name/year0.

- Meet honor Club Criteria plus.
- Net of 15 OR Charter a New Club.

OI President, Ron Huxley Targeted Incentives 2013-2014:

International President Pin of Excellence: District Governors can award this to a club or individual to honor outstanding club service or youth activities during the year.

Recruitment Incentive: Add 3 new optimists at a 'New Optimist Welcomed – NOW' meeting and your

Thanks for interacting with the clubs in your zones as Lt. Governor's. Attached is a summary of the information you were able to obtain from most all of your clubs.

As a general evaluation of the information received the end of the March 2014, the following was interpreted:

- 1) About 15% of the clubs have or will be having a 'New Optimist Welcomed' NOW meeting.
- 2) There was an increase of 19 members so far in the month of March.
- 3) There was also a loss of 11 members so far in the month of March.
- That is an increase of 'net 8' for March 2014.
- 5) It seems like most new members join as a result of a club event or activity involving the kids in the community.

To provide a status of membership, requested by Governor George Breadon and Optimist International, the following reflects the T-Shot status as of March 28th, 2014:

Zone 1:	4 additional Optimists in March	(Menomonee Falls – 4)
Zone 2:	1 additional Optimist in March	(Racine Wednesday – 1)
Zone 3:	2 additional Optimists in March	(Whitewater Club – 2)
Zone 4:	2 additional Optimists in March	(Jefferson – 2)
Zone 5:	1 additional Optimist in March	(East Madison-Monona – 1)
Zone 6: Noon – 3)	5 additional Optimists in March	(UW Lacrosse Student – 1; Monroe Morning – 1; Monroe
Zone 7:	4 additional Optimists in March	(Mt. Horeb – 3; Verona – 1)
Zone 8:	No additional Optimists in March.	

The T-Shots reflect as of March 28th, that there are 97 new members in SWIS, 172 members have been deleted so far this year, with a net of -75 for the year in membership. (The retention rate is almost 96%).

Issues of The Optimist magazine were placed on the tables for guests to read, Optimist placemats were on the tables for the meal that had been planned, and our presenters were ready to share the topics they were most passionate about. We invited our Governor and our Lieutenant Governor to top off the special attention for our newcomers. Our registration table was prepared to greet our guests and distribute their packets as we welcomed them.

Once guests were seated with their sponsors, the evening began with dinner. We chose some of our most visible and popular programs to share and also showed the "I Am an Optimist" DVD.
