Encourage businesses to be Friends of Optimists. While you are at it, remember the other criteria for Honor Club: 3 projects, recognize a club member or community member with an award, be current in dues to SWIS and OI, and fill out your 2 reports – the Club Officer Elect Report and the year-end President's Pride report. The President's Pride report is on line at optimistleaders.org. You can enter your items now and wait until September 30 to "submit". This report documents your projects and award to the Club or community member. Let's work hard and have as many clubs as possible make Honor Club!

We need to finish the year strong and make a smooth transition for Josh and his slate of officers. The children do not care whether it is September 30 or October 1. They need the support of each and every Optimist. Let's work "Right Here, Right Now" to make this year the best it can be so that next year "Together We Can" make a difference in the lives of children.

throughout the year; and HONORED ONE person in your club or community! This ends the Board Recommendations for the last 5 years.


For the next 5 years, all details for HONOR CLUB are similar EXCEPT you will need to add PLUS 3 members by year end!

1.5 million youth are served annually by programs funded by the foundation. The Foundation depends on support from Optimist clubs and individual members, the general public, businesses and corporations.

I want to personally thank all of the Club Foundation Representatives (CFRs), clubs and members out there that have contributed to the foundation for the 2015-2016 year. I appreciate all the work your clubs do to support the foundation. The foundation reaches out to youth and service programs and is proudly served by Optimist clubs and the community. It is still not too late for your clubs or individual members to consider giving to the foundation for the 2015-2016 Optimist year. Those of you that have the honor as serving as President for the 2016-2017 year, should be thinking about what member will be your Club Foundation Representative (CFR).

My club, the Sun Prairie Optimist club was recently awarded a \$1000.00 grant from the Allstate Foundation thanks to a member of ours Monica Titley, CEO and Exclusive agent at Allstate Insurance. If your Optimist club is seeking grant funds or contributions for funding of your charitable community service projects or other charitable, literacy or educational programs, you may request the assistance of Optimist International Foundation (OIF) as a 501 (c) (3) charitable organization.

Please follow the guidelines below to qualify for the Club Through Grant Program.

Guidelines:

Complete the OIF Pass Through Grant Application and mail or fax to the Optimist International Foundation office.

If you are trying to secure a grant from a corporation or foundation that has their own Grant Application Form, please complete any information pertaining to the Club (but leave the 501 (c) (3) signature section blank) and forward that to the Philanthropy Relations Manager, OIF. They will complete the information regarding the 501 (c) (3) and attach any documents that may be necessary. The foundation will also send the completed form and documents to the corporation/foundation/grantor.

Checks received from corporations/foundations/grantors must be made payable to "Optimist International Foundation". OIF will deposit the check and issue a check to the Club for the amount received after the check has cleared the OIF bank. Unless otherwise directed, the check will be sent to the Club officer who signed the application form. A tax receipt will be issued to the corporation/foundation/ grantor in January of the following year.

The Club must report to OIF a final accounting of all grant funds received, using the form that will be mailed with the OIF check issued to the Club. OIF cannot proceed with any further Club Pass Through Grants for the Club until a final report is received from the Club.

Please Note:

The amount of funds qualifying for this program is \$100 or more per Donor/grantor. OIF cannot process Pass through gifts that are property or real estate. Recognition items are not applicable with Pass Through Grant funds.

I am wondering if it would make good sense to appoint someone within your club to monitor member's attendance at meetings and involvement in club activities. Not government type monitoring but loving "parent type" monitoring. We all know the golden rule that suggests - "Assign an activity to a new member and get them involved in a club activity as soon as possible." The reason for this, of course, is to make the new member feel comfortable and give them a sense of belonging and self worth. It is a good idea and well worth pursuing.

PTO Question - Are you paying attention to the attendance and activities of member's that have more "time in grade"? These folks make up the heart and soul of your club and unfortunately they are also the folks that we get into the bad habit of depending upon to do all of the work - **or none of the work**. Our mistake is that we allow them to do the bulk of the work over and over again because they "know how" - "have always done it" - "want to do it" and on and on. While all of these reasons may be true - doesn't it make sense to ask those that haven't been too involved to help as well?

Think of the benefits. Clubs lose members because a member loses interest in the club - usually because they feel "burned out" and not appreciated or they have not gotten involved and they get bored - they simply lose interest.

Having someone looking at attendance and participation on a regular basis makes good sense and will help with member retention. Giving some help to the busy and active members makes good sense. Paying attention to those members that are coasting along - makes good sense. It is an easy task that can help your club remain strong.

Please give it some thought. Just remember - Everyone joined your club for a reason. Revisit those reasons and see if you are meeting their needs. Make your members feel that there is something in them and help their Optimism come true.
