Thoughts From District Membership Chair CoryAnn St. Marie-Carls

You ask – Why is NOW the time to Welcome New Optimists? The SWIS District is approximately 40 new members away from a GAIN in District Membership for the 2016-17. If every club joins a new member we can end stronger than ever serving more kids.

Q Pres: What is the first Step to getting more new members, we haven't gotten many lately?

Wisconsin Leadership Seminars would like to thank the SWIS District Optimists for sponsoring 17 students to attend the 40th annual WILS Seminar held June 9th-11th, 2017 at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. We had about 240 students in attendance for this year's seminar, and the number of students we serve continues to grow! The high-energy WILS weekend is free of charge to students and their schools and consists of team-building activities, motivational speakers, community service, and panels of key leaders from various industries, small group discussions, a talent show and more.

We are so grateful that in 2017, Wisconsin Optimist Clubs were a Gold Sponsor (our highest sponsorship level) and sponsored their highest number of WILS attendees in over a decade! Clubs from the SWIS District donated \$3,450 in sponsorships to WILS, covering the cost for 17 students who attended the 2017 seminar. WILS would like to thank you all for your contributions that allow us to keep offering this program free of charge to the attendees, their parents, and their schools.
