Contestants from local clubs will be ages 6 through 13 and we encourage all SWIS District Clubs to plan and host local contests in home communities Local clubs can then choose their participants who will represent their clubs at the SWIS District contest.

For those clubs who have not run Tri Star Basketball events in the recent past, we ask you to consider 2018 as the year to get back in the game! This is not a difficult project to run and it need not be expensive. Clubs tell us that they are able to use school or YMCA facilities at little or no cost and they are able to recruit high school students (future Optimists) to help stage the event.

Most clubs tell us the biggest challenge they face is marketing their local event to attract a good number of participants. Otherwise, this can be handled by starting early and often with publicity. Make sure your local kids get a chance to join us.

Let's pick a date and get going now! We can promise that your local club participants will have a fun filled day at the SWIS District contest. We also conduct a raffle to give away lots of great gifts for them. Can we count on you to support us? SWIS District Tri Star Basketball is still the largest gathering of kids at the District level.


