

#### Secretary, Laura Guitierrez, WI Department of Safety and Professional Services of Heroin Epidemic / Drug Prescription Monitoring Program




As a Secretary for Governor Walker, Laura Guitierrez gives an 18 year educator perspective to the Opiod program. The Opiod program, through pharmacies, was started in 2013 with all prescribers needing to go through the system as a monitor with currently 40,000 records in the system. In April 2017 all prescribers - doctors. dentists need to go through system as a monitor check which currently has 40,000 records.
