

In past years, we have mailed out that packet in January to every club in the SWIS District. The **SWIS District competition will be in Mukwonago on April 18, 2020**. This gives you over three months to schedule your local contests and arrange for your chosen participants to be registered well in advance for the district contest. 

A Call for Milwaukee-Area Mentors

Hi Optimists! Cory Ann St. Marie Carls and Amanda Szymkowski here! About a month and a half ago we met with Mike Greul, Social Sciences and Theology Teacher at St. Thomas More High School. He told us about a mentorship program for the Sophomores. If you or someone you know is in the Milwaukee-area and would be interested in being a mentor, read Mike's message below:

"Our goal is to provide encouragement and accountability for our students as they learn what it means to be servant leaders, starting with goals that they are setting for this year! In the interest of your valuable time, here is a basic rundown of expectations:

Communicate with students monthly through whatever combination of meetings, phone calls, and emails works best for your schedules.

• **First Semester:** To model good communication and encourage a strong mentor relationship from the start, we are asking mentors this year to initiate contact starting in September.

• **Second Semester:** Starting in January, we will give students starter questions and want to shift responsibility on them to initiate conversation, as well as to be proactive in scheduling times to talk.

Consider writing a (surprise!) letter of encouragement for them to receive during their Sophomore Retreat in late February. Letters can be emailed to me or mailed to the school (address in signature line.) Fill out and return a scanned copy of the attached form at your earliest convenience.

Please feel free to contact me at any time throughout the year with questions or concerns! Thank you again for taking time out of your other responsibilities, activities, and family/leisure time to help a student grow as a leader for others!"
