#### Keynote Speaker: Mark Weinsoff, OI President

He shared his story of joining an Optimist Club, which was both humorous and inspirational. He concluded by stating we are better human beings as Optimists.

#### Guest Speakers: Jessica Delger and Rose Cutting

Members were captivated by moms Jessica and Rose who shared their personal experiences with having a child on the Autism Spectrum.

16 years ago, Rose first received the autism diagnosis for her son. She has taken her struggles and lessons learned and turned them it into opportunities to help others. She is the Executive Director and co-founder of a non-profit autism awareness organization called Aiming for Acceptance.

The last three years have been challenging for Jessica. First, her son was diagnosed with autism at the age of two and a half. After working with therapists to improve his motor and speech skills, he was then diagnosed with a malignant brain tumor that had spread to his spine and left him blind.

We were so honored to hear two moms sharing their very personal "Power of One" stories about facing and conquering life's challenges.

2020 was a year of challenges, heartbreak, separation, death, and triumph. But the light of hope was our health care professionals. There are not enough words to fully express our gratitude for their selflessness and dedication. They gave of themselves to save others. There were tears of joy and tears of sorrow, all while doing what they are trained to do: Save Lives!

To inspire youth of Southern Wisconsin to be the force of positive change now and in the future.


#### **Optimist Club of Milwaukee**

Lodi Optimist Club




